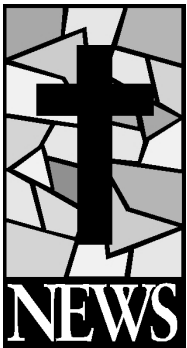

The veranda was located at the end of the house and was encased in beautiful beveled glass panes, with French doors that led out to my mother's rose garden. At one end of the room was a large flowered couch, with a coffee table in front of it. Every day, as I was finishing up my homework, Mr. Wonge would bring in the tea at 4:00 pm sharp. There were always yummy homemade cookies or short bread biscuits, cream, sugar and of course TEA.

Mom would always help me with my letters and my numbers and when that was all done, she would go check on my brother who was napping during tea time and then I knew what time it was. It was time for JUST US! Mama would pick up the book which had an old piece of cloth in it as a book mark. We'd sit on the duvet, with me cuddled up under her arm as she would begin to read the story. I felt like the luckiest girl in the world because my Mama could make time stand still with the dance of her hand as she turned each page. I always imagined myself as one of the characters experiencing each moment of the action.

At the end of each chapter Mama would give me a kiss and say, tomorrow's another day honey. And that would always signal the end of our story time in the veranda. Many pages have turned since my days in the veranda with Mama, but I always remember, cherish, and live in the blessings that were early gifts in my life. Those are the memories that I hold in my heart, always knowing that the people of God have been blessed in so many ways.

As we begin the New Year, may I encourage you to never forget the blessings of your life. Even in the most challenged lives there are blessings that make up the courage, tenacity, love, peace, joy, and faith of the human spirit. May you and yours have a very blessed New Year...always remembering the blessings and that you are a child of The Most High.

A Message From Our Pastor

Rev Dr. Ron Watson

Dear Friends,

This double issue helps save money, and that has been a very large theme in our ministry as of late. The world keeps changing as does Trinity, but thankfully, God remains the same! Praise God! As for the church, you will be receiving a copy of the budget for your perusal prior to our Congregational Meeting on January 29, 2012. Let me tell you about it ahead of time so you will be ready.

First, let me say that the elders of the church whom you elected prepare and pass the budget of the church, with the exception of the salary of the pastors. Now that Sheryl has been ordained, you will presumably be voting on her call as well as mine. Don Scott, our wonderful Minister of Visitation, receives no salary, therefore no voting is required. At the annual meeting, you will not be voting on the budget itself, but you may ask questions. I urge you, however, to submit these in writing ahead of time so that your question might be answered at the meeting.

Second, you will only be receiving the budget one week in advance. The budget in all likelihood will not be approved prior to the Session meeting on January 16. This will allow us to consider late arriving pledges as we prepare our budget. I can tell you right now that we currently have no plans for new spending in 2012, and the budget that is submitted will most likely reflect that. Though it might appear "last minute," this budget has been in preparation since August and has not been hastily considered.

Three, it is my personal hope and goal that the budget submitted will be balanced. As you know, we have had to discontinue one position on our staff, reduce a second by half, and put a third on hiatus. The response to our Stewardship Campaign will largely determine what changes will come in the future.



And lastly, the elders voted at last night's stated meeting to make a request of the congregation. Many of you may have come from northern UPCUSA churches and were asked to pay for your per capita

apportionment to the General Assembly. What is per capita apportionment? It dates back to the earliest origins of the Presbyterian Church in the colonies. "Per capita is an opportunity for all communicant members of the Presbyterian church through the governing bodies to participate equally, responsibly, and interdependently by sharing the cost of coordination and evaluation of mission; and of performing ecclesiastical, legislative, and judicial functions that identify a Reformed Church, while at the same time strengthening the sense of community among all Presbyterians." (<http://oga.pcusa.org/percapita/faq.htm>).

This year's cost is \$6.63 per member. In years past, we have asked everyone to make a contribution for envelopes at the first of the year, and we have paid the per capita apportionment from the general fund, some \$3500. This year we are asking all of our members to pay \$10 for per capita and for the cost of envelopes at the first of the year. This cost is per member, not per household. By sharing this cost with individuals, it will greatly aid our attempt to present a fair and balanced budget.

Thank you for your support and understanding at this critical time in the life of Trinity. Any additional gifts you can make at the end of this year will be received as a blessing to this congregation and its mission to show the world the heart of Christ Jesus. May the blessings of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit be yours in this New Year!

If It Is of God?

(34) A Pharisee named Gamaliel, a teacher of the Law, respected by all the people, stood up in the Council and gave orders to put the men outside for a short time. (35) And he said to them, "Men of Israel, take care what you propose to do with these men.
