

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

This being a May/June issue of the newsletter, I have two important items to make you aware of. I'll take them in the order that they occur. First, the month of May is

"Trinity Legacy Month."

We began this tradition last year to coincide with Wills Emphasis Sunday (May 15 this year). It's surprising to me how many people do not have a will. (I have one, but it needs to be updated, so full disclosure here). Making a will is one way to be a good steward of God's gifts. We know that we have no need of our earthly goods in the next life, but leaving these for the use of our family and our church family is a great way to leave a legacy that is decent and in order. We use the phrase that all things should be done "decently and in order," but that Presbyterian catch phrase is lifted directly from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians (1 Corinthians 14:40) It is from a larger text that specifically addresses worship, but Paul broadens the context with the words, "but *all things* should be done decently and in order." So we should order not only our lives but the legacy we leave to others. Whether it is due to apathy, superstition, or trouble dealing with the issue of the finite time we have on this earth, we would be wise and loving to arrange resources for those who will come after us. In the communion of the saints, I urge all the members of Trinity to consider the kind of legacy they would like to leave behind.

Speaking of worship, you are most likely aware that we now have three services including our Contemporary Worship at 9:30. The elders were confronted with a great challenge, however, in how to conduct our summer schedule. Since many are away when school is out and Florida get increasingly warmer, our attendance gets a bit thin. In the past, we

have tried having one service in July. Our other challenge is stopping a new service that has attracted new people to our church. After considerable deliberation, the Session has come up with a **Summer Worship Schedule** that will coincide with the school recess calendar. What might be best described as a hybrid service (an analogy my fellow golfers will appreciate), will begin June 12th and go through August 14th. At 9:30, contemporary worshipers will begin with a service very much like what they are used to. Transitional music will begin a few minutes before 10 am. At 10 am, we will have a traditional service with the sermon coming very early in the service. After the sermon, we will pass the peace. Those who have come at 9:30 will, presumably, pass the peace and go home. Those who came at 10:00 am will stay for the rest of their normal traditional service. Think of it as overlapping services if you will. Those who come at 9:30 will experience just one service and those who come at 10:00 will also experience just one service with a slightly different order than during the rest of the year. The sermon time and the passing of the peace will be "shared" with both services. The wonderful thing about this is that, for a period of weeks this summer, three services will become one. What a great experience for Trinity church-three in one!

It is my great hope that **Trinity Legacy Month** and the **Summer Worship Schedule** will make us a more vibrant and unified church. May God continue to bless us all as we make our pilgrim journey together.

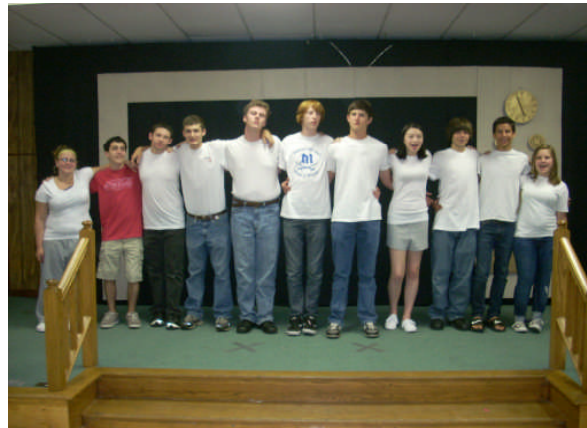

MISSION BIRTHDAY OFFERING NEWS

Trinity's Missions & Social Concerns Committee introduced the Mission Birthday Offering Program this year with the goal of increasing the amount of money available for missions. Thanks to the generosity of those who had birthdays in January, February and March, nearly \$1800 was received and checks were sent to Hope Network, the Family Life Center, and the Duvall Home.

One of those organizations, Hope Network, may not be familiar to many of you. Imagine if you received a notice from a utility company that it was going to shut off your electricity or water, or if you received an eviction notice. What would you do?

In 2010 Hope Network helped 612 Flagler County households facing this scenario by assisting with rent and utility payments. Potential clients are thoroughly screened at the Hope Network office to determine their need and eligibility and they can only receive help once a year. Checks are then sent directly to the utility company or landlord, not to the individuals.

Funding comes from local churches, a Palm Coast water grant and FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency). Hope Network does not expect to receive much help from FEMA this year, so the Missions Committee hopes it can increase its support.

We hope when your birthday card arrives you will respond as generously as you are able.
