

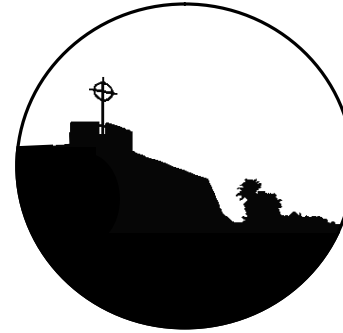
SESSION BRIEFS

At its Stated Meeting on August 16, 2010, your Session:

- Noted that our Active Membership is 605, and we have 23 Affiliate Members.
- Approved the use of Mehaffey Hall, Kepler and Geneva Rooms for the use of the Holiday Fair on November 5th and 6th.
- Noted that the Stewardship Campaign for 2011 will be getting an earlier start this year.
- Approved placing a monthly statement in the Sunday bulletin, which will give members of the congregation information on the financial condition of the church.
- Noted that this year's Vacation Bible School was the best ever, an indication that we (Trinity) are doing something right.
- Approved the following dates for Christian Education: "Rock the Universe" – September 11; Trinity Troopers begin – September 15; Rally Day – September 19; First day of Sunday School – September 26.

- Approved Resolutions of Thanks to (1) Jan Roberts for coordinating the Sanctuary Guild and the Chancel Flowers during the period when there was no Worship Committee member doing it; (2) Carol Corson, for organizing a wonderful Vacation Bible School; (3) Phyllis Hunter for faithfully serving on the TLC Committee for 20 years.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

When Delphine announced her imminent departure to the Session, a search committee was formed to find a new organist. The committee then discovered an extraordinary candidate who was literally in our backyard (Flagler Beach, to be more specific). After an interview and audition, the committee unanimously recommended Paige Long to become our new Organist/Pianist. Paige is the former Director of Music at St. James Episcopal Church in Ormond Beach. This is not her only talent however. Paige Long is an internationally recognized flute choir director and contrabass flutist. Currently, Paige directs the New England Conservatory Summer Metropolitan Flute Festival Orchestra and the Florida Flute Orchestra. As an active guest flute clinician and ensemble director, she has led workshops and directed flute ensembles for music schools in France, Germany and Mexico, as well as for flute associations throughout America. She performs with the International Flute Orchestra, serves on the executive board of the Florida Flute Association, the Low Flutes Committee of the National Flute Association and is past president of the Greater Boston Flute Association. Paige's son, Sean, passed away unexpectedly. It is my fervent hope that she and Jim will find in us a loving church family that will surround them with the comfort we know in the Holy Spirit. The "open heartedness" we express in our mission statement will be needed in great supply in support of Paige and Jim. I trust that our congregation will receive the Longs with loving care and concern.

One of Paige's duties is to lead music in what I am now calling our possible "Contemporary Worship Experiment." I have carefully chosen the word experiment because we have no idea what type of success this might be. The Session will most likely vote on when to start this service at their September meeting, and I will let the congregation know in a timely fashion once a decision has been reached. Let me reemphasize that if we do move forward, it will be with as little disruption to our current schedule as possible. Please also be aware, should we decide to proceed, the service will be conducted in the Reformed tradition. What does that mean?

"Reformed worship is *covenantal*. In the blessed covenant relationship there is two-way traffic. As a result, the various "elements" of Reformed worship can be divided into two groups: first, those elements that come from the Lord, such as his blessing and his word; second, those that come from us, his people, such as praise and prayer and offerings, but most of all the sacrifice of a repentant and thankful heart." - *The Beauty of Reformed Liturgy* (Premier, 1980).

I am writing you all to thank you for supporting my service/mission work in Guatemala this coming year as I serve the Presbyterian Church as a Young Adult Volunteer (YAV). Thank you for supporting me with your prayers, financially, and through all the love and care you have shown to me over the years I have been a member at Trinity. I am so thankful and grateful to have received the gift of financial support from Trinity's session. I also am writing to thank you for the opportunity to have preached in church at the end of last May. I will be excited to share much more with you when I get back from Guatemala. Trinity has been a church that has nurtured me through my faith journey and I thank all of you for having played a special role in my growth as I continue to serve the church.

This past summer I have been working in the Louisville PC(USA) offices with the Advisory Committee on Social Witness Policy (ACSWP). For more on what this committee does please visit: gamc.pcusa.org/acswp. This committee has written a lot of the PC(USA)'s social justice policies that have been adopted by the General Assembly. For example, at this year's General Assembly in July, ACSWP policies that were passed included Gun Violence Prevention; Equity and Quality in Public Education; Becoming an AIDS and HIV Competent Church; and others. This coming year I found out that I will be working in a women's shelter in Quetzaltenango, Guatemala. This women's shelter has 5 program areas which include: 1) the shelter 2) a daycare for the women's children 3) a health program that includes a clinic and counseling 4) vocational training for the women 5) raising community awareness on issues of gender rights. I am looking forward to working with this organization and sharing my experiences with you.

Obesity is the greatest risk factor of all for diabetes . . . They have 7 times the cardiovascular events of men and a 50% death rate. Having Diabetes means one has CVD.

Hypertension is a bigger risk if it begins before menopause, or if still on oral contraceptives (especially overweight women), and blood pressure develops with aging. It will lead to stroke and changes in artery walls leading to aneurisms if not treated to acceptable levels. **Stress**, depression, and **smoking** need to be addressed with medical caregivers as they, too, are risk factors and increase BP and heart rate and constrict arteries and reduce blood oxygen levels among other things. Last but not least is a **sedentary lifestyle** as a risk factor as it will be a large contributing basis for obesity, hypertension, elevated blood sugar, and high blood cholesterol. Being more active will reduce all of the above and cut a CVD event risk factor in half! It will also alleviate depression symptoms and stress.

Next month will be a discussion of female CVD symptoms, treatment and medication.

Health Ministry Tidbits

Women respond uniquely to many diseases and recent discoveries have revolutionized the way women should be treated for them but especially so with cardiovascular diseases (CVD). While CVD is the leading killer of both sexes in the USA the American Heart Association has new guidelines for preventing CVD in women.

Risk factors are either non modifiable or modifiable: **sex-** male rates of disease and death are declining but women's are steady at 500,000 per year; **age-**women after menopause are a considerable risk and even taking estrogen for "hot flashes" does not provide protection but can have increases in clotting problems so only short term hormone therapy is used now; **genetics-** inherited susceptibility patterns appear in families; although for unknown reasons at present, **ethnicity** is a factor of risk especially for African-American women with a 40% higher death rate than Mexican-American or white women. Identifying and altering the following modifiable risk factors can improve the outcome for women. **Obesity** is a key factor leading to Diabetes and **blood lipid** disorders. A body mass index (BMI)

should be 18-24 and waist circumference of 35" or less. A weight loss of as little as 10% is helpful. High cholesterol with low HDL, the good cholesterol, or elevated triglycerides will lead to arterial plaque changes in artery walls and blocked arteries throughout the body. These arise from a diet high in carbohydrates and fat' as we are all aware. What it does is double the risk of a cardiovascular event. Obesity leads to **Diabetes**, The Nurses' Health Study says. The study is still ongoing and several women in the congregations are still participating,

46 adults and teens staffed VBS

15 others helped in various ways before and after VBS

The 2010 VBS mission project raised \$385.88, the most ever.

All of the money has been sent to Heifer International to send 3 goats (\$120 each) and a flock of ducks, geese, or chicks (\$20 per flock) to the Zambia Rural Community Development project. The balance will be used for seeds.

These gifts will help raise more families out of poverty.

Over 35 parents and grandparents came to the closing ceremony of VBS.

They watched the children sing, dance, and drum. Many of the children came back on Sunday morning to sing for the second worship service.

Trinity was transformed into the African savannah for five days. Everyone gathered around a giant baobab tree to learn, worship, and create. The children enjoyed crafts, science, storytelling, games, dance and drums, and a snack each day. Baobab Blast provided an enthusiastic celebration for all. I send heartfelt thanks to all who helped make this year's VBS such a success.

If you loaned materials to the church for VBS, it is time now to pick them up. You will find them at the north end of the Geneva classroom (which is across from Kepler Conference Room). We thank you so much for sharing your items. They made our decorations much more realistic and beautiful.
